



Surveying the Condition & Assessing the Conservation, Repair & Maintenance Requirements of Traditional Buildings

COURSE DESCRIPTION:	<p>This 2 day course, encompassing both classroom based and on-site work, will provide those attending with an understanding of the skills and techniques involved in surveying the condition and assessing the conservation, repair and maintenance requirements of a wide range of Traditional and Historic Buildings. In addition to Fyvie Castle and Fyvie Kirk, both of which are in excellent condition, a number of other Buildings on the Estate in varying states of repair will be surveyed in order to enable those attending to gain an understanding of the breadth of design, detail and materials used in the construction as well as the Conservation, Repair and Maintenance of Traditional Buildings.</p> <p>The course is aimed at Architects, Construction Industry Professionals, Estate Staff, Private Owners and Representatives of Conservation Organisations, as well as Local Authority and Government Agency Staff/Officials, Building Surveyors, and those responsible for the care and maintenance of traditional/historic buildings.</p>
